Tweaking Familiar Sources to learn more about a "Mystery Mama"

- Birth, baptismal, marriage, and death records of her known children
- Her obituary and those of proposed or possible sisters or brothers
- Death records, wills, probate records of potential parents
- Naming patterns of her children and grandchildren
- Old newspapers using her husband's or known children's names
- Cemetery records: who is buried nearby?
- Census records Land records Church records
- Family Bibles, Military & Pension records

- Study the men in her life
