## Activity Ideas:



<u>Snowy Window</u>: A winter window is definitely in the forecast! First, peel the sticker from one end of a plastic thread spool and pour a thin layer of white tempera paint into a shallow container. Then repeatedly dip the uncovered end of the thread spool into the white paint and press it onto a 9"x12" sheet of dark blue construction paper. When the desired effect is achieved, sprinkle the flurry of snowflakes with clear or silver glitter. Shake off the excess glitter and allow drying time. To create window panes, glue three 1/2"x9" black paper strips and three 1/2"x12" black paper strips onto the project as pictured. *themailbox.com* 

<u>Snowman Snack</u>: Place two English muffin halves on a plate, one above the other, like a snowman. Spread cream cheese or white cake icing on the muffins. Add M&M candies or raisins for the eyes and mouth. Add a baby carrot for the nose. Add a piece of a fruit leather strip (fruit roll-up) for the scarf. *prekinders.com*
